These prices pretty much cover all your shipboard expenses except liquor, shopping and gratuity.

I would recommend you book with Holland America both the airport to ship and ship to airport transfers if you are arriving or departing the day the cruise starts or finishes. They will meet you at the baggage check coming and drop you at the right terminal departing. The Seattle airport is about 30 minutes from the cruise terminal. I would estimate it's about \$60 for each person both ways.

Shore excursions are not included and can run \$90 - \$500 per day depending what you choose to do. Three days are cruising only so excursions are only available four days, one of which is not a full day. You do not have to book any excursions but they can add a lot to what you get to see.

I also recommend a Veranda room as you can both look out or step out and take good pictures from it. Most ocean view rooms look out on the main deck and beside many having an obstructed view, people walking on deck can see into your room. We have done several cruises and at least 50% if not more of my pictures were taken from our verandas and not on deck. Most port arrivals are early morning before we were up and dressed for breakfast.

We can also book seven-day Alaska cruises from Vancouver, BC. A quick check of air fares from Chicago to Vancouver and Seattle showed flying to Seattle is considerably less expensive. If the cruise leaves from Seattle the ship must stop in another country by law before returning to the U S, so there is a stop in Victoria, BC which is just our last evening. You don't need a passport to visit Victoria from the ship but you would need one to fly to Vancouver. This same cruise from Seattle is available on both 9/3/2025, and 9/13/2025.

We have usually used open seating where you just show up at the dining room and give them your name and party size and are either seated right away or call you when they have a table ready. On our first cruise we were assigned a to a table of 10 and had dinner at the early sitting. There are both an early (5:30pm) and a late sitting (8:00pm). We liked the open seating as we went when we were ready not at a prescribed time. However, I recommend we have a fixed table time would get our group all together every day. I recall we had two adjacent tables on the 2009 Cruise from San Diego to Mexico. The ship also has two shows each evening If you go to the early one you can make to late dinner and vice versa. We used to go up to the crow's nest for Happy hour which was 5 - 6pm (two drinks for the price of one) and then go to dinner from there.

These prices were as of November 2024 and will either go up or down depending on the demand. Since COVID Alaska has been a relatively safe place to travel to and in addition to always being popular.

We each would make our own reservations with our group coordinator at Holland. We will be able to have a fixed diner tables at the same setting. We can arrange a meeting room for our business meeting and possibly one for a last night gift exchange if we wish. We are not too small a group, (5 or more cabins) to have group assistance, there are a few perks but no significant savings.
